

Regis Central PCN Health Care Team (Community Nursing and Proactive Care Team)

Co-located multidisciplinary community team. Visiting patients requiring nursing care in their own homes. Working alongside other health professionals and social services. Supporting and educating patients to self-care and manage long- term conditions.

Our community nurses play a crucial role in caring for some of the most vulnerable people in our communities: housebound patients who have a long-term health condition and/or are frail elderly who are registered with a local GP.

As well as providing direct patient care, community nurses also work with patients to enable them to care for themselves or with family members teaching them how to give care to their relatives.

Community nurses play a vital role in keeping hospital admissions and readmissions to a minimum and ensuring that patients can return to their own homes as soon as possible. In Brighton and Hove our community nurses work alongside colleagues as members of our integrated primary care teams
