

## Brighton Central Integrated Primary Care Team

In primary care there is a team approach to mentoring of students to allow insight into the different nursing roles in a community nursing team (Community Nurse Lead, Case Manager, Staff Nurse, Assistant Practitioner and Health Care Assistant), with a named practice assessor responsible for the assessment of practice. The team works between the hours of 08:00 and 20:00 hours. Between 20:00 and 08:00 there is an out of hour's service (OOH) covered by South East Health. Students can spend time with the OOH team but this needs to be planned in advance with the OOH team leader

### Working Patterns

Variety of 7.5 hour shifts between 08:00 and 20:00 hours

Students should arrive at the team office by 8:00 a.m. to meet the team.

You will be required to always wear your student uniform with ID badge. A 'bare below the elbow' is strictly enforced – so no nail varnish or jewellery apart from a plain wedding band. Shoes should be comfortable and fit for nursing. Please consider the weather and dress accordingly, preferably in layers which can be added or removed if necessary.
