



Brighton East Integrated Primary Care Team

Based on 2nd floor, Dyke Building the community nursing team comprises of 1x Clinical Nurse Lead, 1x Case Manager, 6x Registered Community Practitioners, 2x Health Care Assistants and 1 x Assistant Practitioner. We cover 4 GP Practices -

- Woodingdean Medical Centre
- 130 The Ridgeway Surgery
- St Lukes Surgery
- Grand Ocean Medical centre

The community nursing team supports students from all cohorts including SCPHN students, emphasis is on career and personal development and positive attitude to student's learning and encourages student participation in team activities. The community Nurse caseload varies during the year offering a range of learning opportunities toward achieving your learning outcomes. In primary care there is a team approach to supervising students to allow insight into the different nursing roles in the team, with a named assessor responsible for the assessment of practice.

Working Patterns

The team works between the hours of 08:00 and 20:00 hours.

- Early: 0800 to 1600 (7.5hrs)
- Late: 1000 to 1800.

There is also a collaborative late shift, shared between Integrated Primary Care Teams and Rapid Response Team from 1200 to 2000.

Between 20:00 and 08:00 there is an out of hour's service (OOH) covered by South East Health. Students can spend time with the OOH team, but this needs to be planned in advance with the OOH team leader

Students should arrive at the DN office at an agreed time to meet the team. Please wear uniform. Shoes should be comfortable and fit for nursing (no high heels or trainers) Please consider the weather and dress accordingly, preferably in layers which can be added or removed if necessary. ID badges must be in view as you will be visiting people at home and entering a variety of premises where your identity will not be known.
