Type of placement	Ansty Ward is a 30 bedded inpatient ward specialising in urology emergencies and elective urology and digestive disease surgery. We care for day surgery patients along with inpatients and is a Surgical Unit for patients undergoing a range of surgical procedures and medical interventions. Students are allocated a practice supervisor and practice assessor; however, they will work with other trained members of the nursing team when their mentors are on days off, study leave or annual leave.

Specific requirements	Need to bring swipe card and uniform. Ring ward prior to allocation, at least 2 weeks in advance. Ansty Ward is situated in the main building of Princess Royal Hospital. The placement is accessible by car, bus and train.
