Learning opportunities in the placement The care we provide at Melrose Nursing Home is based on four core values-

- At Melrose Nursing Home we can provide motivating opportunities for Student nurses towards their clinical education/learning.
- The students will have the opportunity to learn independent clinical decision making about several health-related conditions e.g., Stroke, Parkinson's disease, Cardiac diseases, Pulmonary diseases among many others.
- Melrose Nursing home will provide unique opportunities for Student Nurses to experience 'Nursing' which involves anticipation, judgements, and decision making by reading symptoms and relating/associating them to existing or predisposing factors. The learning in this environment will differ from hospital settings as the health resources available at Melrose may need sourcing from external community health professionals. The timeliness of these decisions is imperative to provide safe 'Nursing' care to meet NMC Code of Conduct of providing safe care at all times and under any circumstance. This also considers the wishes of residents and their relatives.
- The student nurses will have the opportunity to experience management of a shift from a Registered Nurse's point of view – managing residents and their relatives and staff (both care and ancillary).
- Melrose has been awarded Platinum Status by the Gold Standard Framework for providing outstanding end of life care. Students will benefit in this opportunity to grasp the concept of 'end of life care' with its stages.
- Understanding our core values will provide student nurses with an insight into long term
 'relationship-based care' and enabling people to live as they wish to. We shall provide an
 ideal opportunity for student nurses to reflect and learn how every action from staff needs
 to continuously consider the impact and benefit for the residents.

In sourcing guidance from community-based professionals, the student nurses will get the opportunity to learn when to access and also work alongside the varied community-based support used at Melrose Nursing Home.
